Nominations open for 2013 West Australian Landcare Awards

2nd April 2013: Landcarers across the state are being encouraged to submit a nomination for the 2013 West Australian Landcare Awards.

The renowned Awards, now in their 23rd year, honour the invaluable work that is being undertaken by the Landcare community, with the winners from all State & Territory Awards going forward as finalists to the prestigious National Landcare Awards in 2014.

There are nine national categories, covering a range of environmental projects and themes, including sustainable agriculture, coastal rehabilitation and Indigenous land management. Individuals, schools, community groups and networks working to protect or restore local environments, farms, coastlines, native vegetation, bushlands, wetlands, waterways, and more, can be nominated.
